County Splits Summary

The State of California's 2011 Assembly District plan splits ten of the 41 counties that were small enough to have been wholly included in a single district. The plan splits eight of the ten counties between two different districts and two of the ten counties between three districts.

There are 58 counties in the State of California. 41 counties had a 2010 U.S. Census population that was small enough to have been included in a single Assembly district without exceeding the district's ideal 2010 population. The ideal 2010 Assembly District population is 465,674. This number was determined by dividing the 2010 population of the State of California by the total number of State Assembly Districts.

There are seventeen counties with 2010 populations that were larger than a single 2011 Assembly district and therefore had to be split between two or more districts. These counties include Alameda, Contra Costa, Fresno, Kern, Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, Sacramento, San Bernardino, San Diego, San Francisco, San Joaquin, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Sonoma, Stanislaus and Ventura.

City Splits Summary

The State of California's 2011 Assembly District plan splits 35 cities that were small enough to have been wholly included in a single district. Thirty-two cities are split

between two different districts and three cities are split between three different Assembly districts. These numbers also do not include zero population splits.

There are 480 recognized cities in the State of California. 474 cities had 2010 PL-94 populations that were small enough to have been included in a single Assembly district without exceeding the district's ideal population. This number does not include non-city entities such as Census Designated Places and neighborhoods. There are six cities with populations greater than a single Assembly District include Fresno, Los Angeles, Sacramento, San Diego, San Francisco and San Jose.
